



Tip #1 - First Day Jitters is a book with a lot of dialogue throughout the story. You could select to voice one character, while your child voices the other. It will enable your child to hear the different characters and practice reading out loud.

Tip #2 – The story starts off with Sarah at home with Mr. Hartwell and their cat and dog. Can you spot the cat and dog throughout the first few pages? It can be fun to study the illustrations and see who else is in the background.



Sandy Bottom Nature Park


1255 Big Bethel Rd, Hampton, VA 23666 Environmental education preserve on 456 acres with a lake & nature center set on reclaimed land.


Buckroe Beach and Park
