Quiet Please, Owen McPhee by Trudy Ludwig is a story that shows how self-reflection can be wonderful in making positive changes in one's life.



The Telephone Game

The Telephone Game is familiar to many people, as it has been around for years. The game can be played by any age and is great for a family fun night. It is a fun way to practice the skill of listening. Players must sit in a circle or

stand in a straight line. They need to be close enough that whispering is possible, but not so close that players can hear each other whisper. The first person

in the line or circle whispers a word or phrase into the ear of the person sitting or

standing to their right. The Players whisper the phrase to their neighbors until it reaches the last player in line. Once the last person has heard the phrase they say it out loud so everyone can hear how much it has changed from the first whisper at the beginning of the circle or line.




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
