A great way to encourage children to read could be to find a book that features the autumn season. the various weather phenomena that occurs during this time, or one that shows upcoming special days or holidays.



It's Fun and Easy!

Chicken Little by Laura Rader, features a young chick who experiences some weather changes and dropping acorns, and concludes that the sky must be falling!

Tip #1 – The story features a lot of dialogue. Nearly every page shows Chicken Little or one of her friends speaking to one another. This is great for reading aloud as parents can create voices to show the different characters and how they speak. Reading aloud is a great way to have children follow the story and for them to have a deeper understanding of language.

Tip #2 – The story also has rhymes mixed in. Rhymes are an excellent way to have children see and hear words with similar sounds. It encourages them to make more connections with the words they encounter on a day-to-day basis. See how many rhyming pairs you can spot in our book-of-the-month!

Cardboard Tube Characters

Make your own Chicken Little characters using empty bathroom tissue cardboard tubes. You'll need: cardboard tubes (1 for each character you make), paint, construction paper, craft feathers, glue, scissors, googly eyes (optional). To make Chicken Little, paint the tube yellow (or cover with yellow construction paper). Cut a small triangle out of construction paper and glue it to the tube for a beak. Draw eyes or glue on googly eyes. Glue yellow craft feathers on her head and on the sides to give her wings. Using different colors, you can make the other bird characters in the book - brown for Henny Penny, red for Cocky Locky, white for Ducky Lucky, and gray for Goosey Loosey! Then act out your own version of the story!

Make Edible Acorns




You can make your own yummy sweet acorns that even Chicken Little would love! You'll need: *candy kisses, chocolate morsels, and mini-vanilla wafer cookies*. Unwrap the candy kisses. Melt a small number of chocolate morsels in the microwave. Dip the flat end of the candy kiss into the melted chocolate, then press it to the flat side of the mini-vanilla wafer to make the acorn "cap." Freeze for 5 minutes to set.

Then, dip a chocolate morsel into the melted chocolate and press on top of the acorn cap to make the stem. Freeze for 5 minutes to set, then enjoy!
