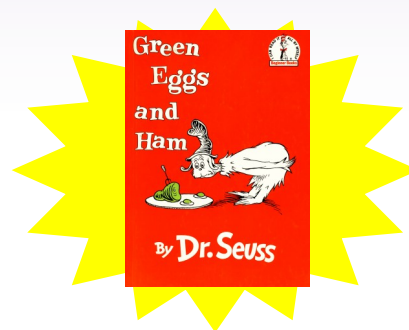


MAYOR'S BOOK CLUB NEWSLETTER

It's Fun and Easy!

Green Eggs and Ham by Dr. Seuss is a classical, whimsical story that features Sam-I-Am trying to convince our main character, or protagonist, to eat green eggs and ham.

Tip #1 – *Green Eggs and Ham* features a lot of repetition, which is excellent for beginning readers. There are only 50 short words repeated throughout the story, so there are opportunities to practice reading and sounding out the words and phrases. This type of practice can also help to expand their vocabulary.

Tip #2 – The story has a lot of rhyming words incorporated. Rhyming words are a great way to have children see and hear similar spelling and sounds. It can also help children sound out the next ending word in the sentence. Rhymes can encourage children to make more connections with the words they encounter every day.

Tip #3 – *Green Eggs and Ham* has bright, colorful illustrations on each page. The imagery can assist children to make the connection between the word and its meaning. For instance, words such as “fox” and “box” appear on one of the pages, and there are illustrations to match. *Green Eggs and Ham* is a great story to read along with children, so they can identify the

Reading Dr. Seuss books with your child will provoke giggles while helping your child to develop phonological awareness.

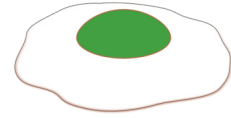

Use food coloring to dye scrambled eggs and add diced up ham to create green eggs and ham. Encourage your child to help you crack the eggs into a bowl and mix with a fork.

Art Time:

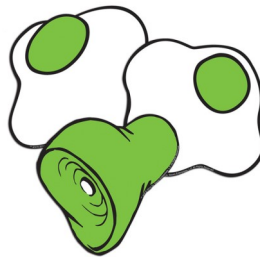
