It's Fun and Easy!

Rainbow Fish and the Big Blue Whale by Marcus Pfister is a story that shows how important it is to communicate and work from a place of understanding.

Tip $\#_1 - Rainbow$ Fish and the Big Blue Whale is a story that has small paragraphs on each set of pages. This book is excellent for a child to listen to a longer story read aloud or even for an emerging reader to practice.

Tip #2 – The story has beautiful illustrations throughout the book. The school of fish and the whale have many interactions throughout the book, and the images support the story. The deep blue ocean, the coral, and the surrounding creatures help bring the story to life.

Tip #3 – **Rainbow Fish and the Big Blue Whale** is a great story to discuss throughout the pages or at the end of the story. The book has a lot of social interactions, and it is vital to share those moments with your child. You can ask questions such as: What happened on this page? Which emotions were the fish feeling here or the whale? Why should we get to know others? Can you name a time you made a friend at school, the park, your neighborhood, etc.? These questions can make the story feel life-like and have time for reflection.


